Empathy

• It is the ability to understand and share the feelings & suffering of another. It involves seeing from another's perspective and imagining what they are experiencing.

Compassion

- It is taking step to relieve the suffering of others. Compassion is the expression of deep empathy in the form of moral action. Compassion is empathy in action.
- Ability to understand and feel' addresses the root causes of suffering. This insight develops sensitivity and guides moral reasoning. It develops ethical competence to deal with moral complexities.
- Instead of being categorial, identify the individual experience.
- Policymaking with sensitivity and responsiveness.
 Gain knowledge of local realities through direct engagement
- Empathy leads to conscience development by awakening us to the humanity in others.

- Empathy reduces prejudice and conflict by helping us understand those different from us. This fosters social cohesion and harmony.
- Bridge between intention and impact. Ushers ethical governance.
- Empathy and compassion recognizes our shared humanity that we all experience suffering, frailty and interdependence.
- Empathy enhances emotional and social intelligence, fosters innovation and creativity.

Example of Empathy & compassion

Principles of Empathy and compassion

Utilitarianism

 Maximizing overall well-being. Empathy and compassion increase happiness and reduce suffering for all, so they are morally right under utilitarianism.

Confucianism

 Emphasizes the importance of ren, or benevolence, which includes the ability to feel empathy for others.

Virtue ethics

 Developing good character traits like kindness, empathy and compassion. Virtue ethicists consider these traits integral to moral excellence and humanity's highest potential.

• Care ethics

 Moral priority is on maintaining relationships and compassionate care. Empathy is essential to understand others' needs and provide care.
 Compassion motivates caregiving.

Engaged Buddhism

 Sees compassion as a key virtue along with wisdom and meditation. Works to remedy social and political injustices, expand human rights and promote peace.

• Altruism

 Altruism is a moral principle centered on selfless concern for the well-being of others. It promotes empathy and compassion as fundamental virtues, encouraging individuals to prioritize the needs and interests of others above their own.
